DESCRIPTION

Under the direction of the Director of Operations / Safety, Lead Solid Waste Worker or Management Staff, deliver exchange and/or repair containers for the automated solid waste collection, serve as a flag man for sewer maintenance department and assist mechanics.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

The following duties are typical for this classification. Incumbents may not perform all of the listed duties and/or may be required to perform additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.

- Drive automated solid waste truck according to a prescribed route.
- Perform pre and post safety check for automated solid waste truck before proceeding on assigned route and returning each day; notify Lead Solid Waste Worker or mechanic of any problems.
- As directed, drive truck to transfer station to unload solid waste or recyclables from truck; if necessary drive truck to main dumping station.
- Be responsible for completing work order on bulky item program, deliveries, exchanges and repairs of the containers utilized for the District's automated refuse collection service.

- Support safety program and encourage safety procedures among all other employees and wear appropriate clothing, including District uniforms, while performing duties.
- Assist mechanics; mounting tire, repairing hydraulic hoses, oil change and other minor repair to fleet.
- Assist sewer maintenance department in setup traffic control and being a flagman.
- Perform general maintenance and janitorial work.
- Respond to citizens' complaints in a courteous manner that will provide the best available service.
- Perform other related duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

The following generally describes the knowledge and ability required to enter the job and/or be learned within a short period of time in order to successfully perform the assigned duties.

Knowledge of:

Pre and Post trip vehicle inspection.

District safety rules and regulations.

Street locations within the District.

Techniques of driving automated solid waste truck.

Operation of air brake system.

Ability to:

Drive automated solid waste truck in a safe manner according to a prescribed route.

Read Thomas Guide map book or Global Positioning System.

Lift solid waste up to 75 pounds.

Handle refuse and containers.

Follow written and oral instructions.

Learn safety procedures.

Work around automated solid waste fleet.

Work around sewer collections system.

Work cooperatively with others.

Respond to customer complaints in a positive manner.

Write simple reports.

Education and Experience:

Any combination equivalent to graduation from twelfth (12) grade and one (1) year experience as a Class B Driver or better, demonstrating a good driving record.

Licenses and Other Requirements:

A valid Class B California Vehicle Operator's License with air brake endorsement, and demonstrating a good driving record.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT

The conditions herein are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential job functions.

Environment: Exposure to noise, dust, grease, smoke, fumes, gases, solvents, electrical energy, radiant energy, toxic materials, and all types of weather and temperature conditions; work in or with water and wastewater; work and/or walk on various types of surfaces including slippery or uneven surfaces and rough terrain; work at heights on scaffolding and ladders.

Physical: Primary functions require sufficient physical ability to walk, stand, stoop, bend, crawl, climb, and kneel; heavy, moderate, or light lifting, pulling and carrying; to operate assigned equipment and vehicles.

Vision: See in the normal visual range with or without correction; vision sufficient to read printed documents and to operate equipment.

Hearing: Hear in the normal audio range with or without correction.
